A family with a full-time dad has many benefits. If the wife is a career woman, her husband can take some family responsibilities off her shoulders, thereby allowing her to compete more successfully in the workplace. The men share in the joy of participating in their children's day-to-day experiences. Differences in parenting styles between men and women are also believed to contribute to children's well-being. Studies suggest that a strong paternal presence encourages greater curiosity, higher self-esteem, and better emotional balance in the child. Societies with strong family units also report lower juvenile crime rates and lower rates of teen pregnancy. Robert Frank, a professor of child development at Oakton Community College in the U.S., notes that working mothers aren't necessarily absent from the home; many women form a close relationship with their kids regardless.

Fraud continues to increase quickly due to constantly changing technology. One example is the Grandparent Scam. An elderly person is contacted over the phone by a person who says he or she is friends with or knows the elderly person's grandchild. The caller uses social media to find out some details that make the story (A)doubting. The caller says the grandchild is very sick, or in the hospital, or traveling far away and needs money immediately. The real (B)motive might be to get money or to obtain personal banking information.

Another type of computer fraud is known as "phishing," or trying to obtain financial information by (C)impersonating a bank employee. One common way we see this type of fraud is in email messages from someone pretending to represent your bank. You are then asked to provide your account number or other identifying information. This kind of deception seems so real that people often respond to it and give away their financial and personal information.

When the Curiosity rover landed on Mars in August of 2012, many of the mission's scientists on Earth decided to live on Mars time for the first 90 days of the mission. They had learned from earlier Mars missions that it is upsetting to their ability to sleep well when they are on Earth time at home and on Mars time at work. And they know that lack of sleep can lead to depression. Such stress does not allow them to keep working. In addition, by changing their schedules to Mars time and stimulating Martian days on Earth, they were able to control the actions of Curiosity when the rover was facing Earth. The Earth takes 24 hours to spin around once, but Mars takes 24 hours and 40 minutes. Mars time quickly becomes different from an Earth day. _____ (A), in two-and-a-half weeks, noon on Mars becomes 4:00 A.M. on Earth. The NASA scientists knew it would be a challenge to live and work on Mars time for 90 days. _____ (B), some of them didn't succeed in making the difficult change in their schedules. They had to go back to a normal Earth schedule due to the difficulties that an additional 40 minutes brought to their daily routine. Those scientists that didn't survive the 90 days said they felt isolated from their families because they rarely saw them.

By the nineteenth century, the largest cities were in Europe. Europeans planned cities around a central business district. The best shops and restaurants were often located in this sector. Wealthy people lived in an area that circled the central business district. Factories and low-quality housing were built away from this center, so poorer people lived in the suburbs. This pattern continues today. In many European cities, the richest residents lived close to the center, whereas the poorest residents live far from the center. _____(A)_____, many North American cities have evolved differently. A well-known sociologist, Earnest Burgess, studied Chicago in the 1920s. He described the development of the city as a series of rings. The inner ring was the central business district. However, wealthy people did not live in the next ring, as they did in European cities. _____(B)_____, this ring had factories and poor housing. The third ring had better housing, but it was still for the working class, that is, people who did physical labor. The fourth ring was the suburbs, where the wealthy lived—in large houses with big yards. Not every North American city follows Burgess’s model; however, it does explain why many cities in the United States have poor communities close to the central business districts and wealthy suburbs far away from the central areas.

While the human mind and body are incredibly resilient, (A)prolonged periods of stress can cause serious damage to our mental and physical well-being. We call this phenomenon “burnout.” ____ (b) ____ So what should we be looking out for? The most common symptoms of burnout can be divided into two main types: emotional and behavioral. Emotional symptoms include a lack of interest in work, a sense of failure or defeat, feeling cynical, and being (B)detached from the world. Behavioral signs to look out for include withdrawal from responsibility, skipping work or school, seeking isolation from others, becoming annoyed easily, and procrastination.

____ (c) ____ Besides knowing which signs to look out for, it’s also good to know which situations are likely to lead to burnout. Education, which of huge benefit to us all, also accounts for much modern stress. As qualifications have become more important, competition has (C)ceased. Today, it can seem more important than ever to achieve the highest standards. ____ (d) ____ However, it may be that this obsession with education, far from being of benefit, actually reduces the quality of students’ education. The periods around exams hold the highest risk of academic burnout. Medical researcher Jacob Shreffler suggests that students should (D)limit study hours per day, take breaks, and make time for fun.

Spinoff technology can help to make our homes and communities safer and more comfortable places to live. Most people are aware that carbon monoxide(CO) buildup in our homes can be very dangerous. This may come from a faulty furnace or fireplace.

(A) Yet another area of concern to people everywhere is the safety and quality of the food they eat. In order to improve food quality for astronauts on lengthy space missions, NASA conducted extensive research and worked with several food companies to find solutions.

(B) In addition to helping people to have clean air, having access to clean water is also of major importance for everyone. NASA engineers have been working with private companies to create better systems for clean, drinkable water for astronauts in space. These systems, which have been developed for the astronauts, can quickly and affordably cleanse any available water. This is a major advantage to the people on Earth who live in remote or developing areas where water is scarce or polluted.

(C) As a result, some people have carbon monoxide detectors in their homes, but these detectors only alert them if the level of carbon monoxide is unsafe. _____, using space technology, NASA developed an air-conditioning system that can not only detect dangerous amounts of carbon monoxide but actually oxidize the toxic gases into harmless carbon dioxide(CO₂). This kind of development makes us realize that removing safety hazards is far better than creating alarms to detect them.

(D) One result was the freeze-drying process. This process allows food to be kept for long periods without refrigeration, while still retaining 98 percent of its nutritional value but only 20 percent of its original weight. Freeze-dried food can be very useful to many people, especially those who live where electricity is not always dependable.
